2745 My Ford I Having since I had the honour to see your Tordship this morning, consulted with Lord Leaforth's Triends, and the Deople who are the most acquainted with his Country, they were f unanimously of opinion that my Services might be of the most essential Utility in the raising and compleating this Corps, and they did not apprehend it would go on with alacity, if I were not engaged in it, your Lordship informs me that His Majestys objections to my being named to the Majority are insuperable, and Sam certain your will readily conceive that Iwould not chuse to have a Company in this Regiment, particularly, even with pennission to sell my Troop: The only Capacity therefore in which Joan Serve His Majesty in Lord Seaforths Cops, must be as Volunteer, which Lord Seaforths Friends imagine will have as good perhaps a better Effect in compleating the Cops than my having obtained the Majority . _ On this Occasion, as I purchased every Step of my Preferment, I begleave to dispose of my Troop, my being permitted to retain the Rank of Captain in the amy I shall consider as a mark of this Majerty's approbation of my present Conduct

Conduct, but should that be thought incompatible with His Majesty Regulations, my endeavours to compleat this Corps shall not be left Lealous. exerted. I shall then accompany it as simple Volunteer, and shall esteem myself sufficiently recompensed if on this or any other Occasion Thave an Opportunity of shewing my attachment to His Majestys Person and Government, and to the Constitutional Cause of my Couns Twait your Lordship's answer, and have the honour table Jour Lordships most-Obed and most-humble Servant.
