Mr Robinson begs leave to have the Honour
to assure Your Majesty that he will not fail to
obey Your Majesty's Commands with all the
Discretion possibly in his Power

Mr Robinson waited acknowledging the
receipt of Your Majesty's Commands until he
had seen Lord North to Day. He has this
Moment left his Lordship in good Spirits,
and he does not find anything that seems
particularly to depress him; the Languor of
yesterday he apprehends might most probably
proceed from the Fatigue of the Night before,
and from a little Irritation of his Mind, expecting
to be leaz'd in the House yesterday, about his
Loan and his Taxes
