Sir

Mr Carlisle mentioned to me your discourse with him, respecting the establishment of the Royal Library, & shewed me yesterday the letter, you favoured him with, to inform me, that if the Quarterly Accounts of the Salaries & Expenditure were forwarded to you, they would have the chance of getting into a regular course of payment.

Your kind attention to such an important concern, required my immediate acknowledgements, & I only delayed to forward to you the accounts, until I could have an opportunity of communicating your obliging offer to Sir Herbert Taylor, with whom I have transacted all the business of the Royal

Library, ever since the commencement of His late
Majesty's indisposition. at his desire, I enclose his
answer to my communication, & have only to add,
that I shall feel myself greatly indebted to you for
all the assistance you are able to give for the confirmation
of so desirable an arrangement.
