I think it my Duty to represent the Insufficiency of the Quarters, at Linsopfield & Oxted, which is 18 Miles from hence and to state, the great distance, that the Men of the Godstone Comp^y are Quartered from their Captain, many I believe I may say most of them from 4 to 8 Miles, & that whenever the Captain chooses to see his Company, the Men must March from 8, to 16 Miles - The Quarters at Blechinghy are by no means good - The Officer, and 30 Men at Meestham, & the Corporal & 20 Men at Gatton will fare very ill, and in case of sickness, will get no Advice, there being no thoroughfare to that Country, thro' Meestham, the Road are neglected, and are not passable in the Depth of the Winter - At Pyegate many of the Men of the two Comp^{ys} are Quartered at 3 & 4 Miles distance from the Town - The Quarters in general are by no means bad - Permit me to say that if the Officers & Men at Meestham, & Gatton could be removed hither though they might not get Room in the Town, they would be Billieted within the Hundred, so near as to see often, & Reported which cannot now be done - every day I can only regret that the Regiment is not more immediately under my own Inspection, that it might have been recruited more carefully, and that when I should have the Honour of turning out again under your Command I might show God bless'd Regim^t in a more useful State, than I can possibly pretend to do in their present dispersed Situation, for it is impossible to answer even for the appearance of the Men should they be suddenly called upon - The Artillery Horses were in very bad Condition, and we had great trouble, in getting them thro' the first days March they were ill shod, & had been worse fed: by dint of oats, they drew the Guns & Waggon with us but in Condition at the time of the Battle of Merton - We were quartered in a house

I believe he was not Displeas'd, as he seem'd to think Lord Amhurst's Plan did
not extend to the Transporting Heavy Baggage.

The Guns, & the Artillery Waggon could not keep up with the March of the Battalion; nor could they have gone through the days March from Gravesend to Billericay at all, if I had not taken upon me, to hire for that day, an Additional horse to each Gun and each Artillery Waggon — With better horses they would have done well, on every other days March, and hardly Impeded the Regiment where the Roads were Level & Firm — I am sorry to say, that wherever Contract Appears, it gives almost as surely Proofs of its Defects

The Barges furnished for the Transport of the Troops, across the Thames, I fear are very bad; & would have defeated the Well laid Scheme of the Ingenious Contriver. One of them Leaked so much, that it has Damaged full one half of the Ball Cartridges, which You had sent to the Regiment from the Park of Artillery. We have only had time to look so far; tho we fear more has suffered from the same Accident — I am glad that this Loss fell only on our Regiment, and at such a time, & that the whole Army at Colchester had not to cross over, in such Boats, to meet an Enemy. Trifling as the Loss now is, I flatter Myself, You will be pleased to obtain, for Us, some Supply, to make this up, as no Carelessness, or Fault of Ours occasioned it: You shall know, as soon as they are Opened, the State of the Remainder is
