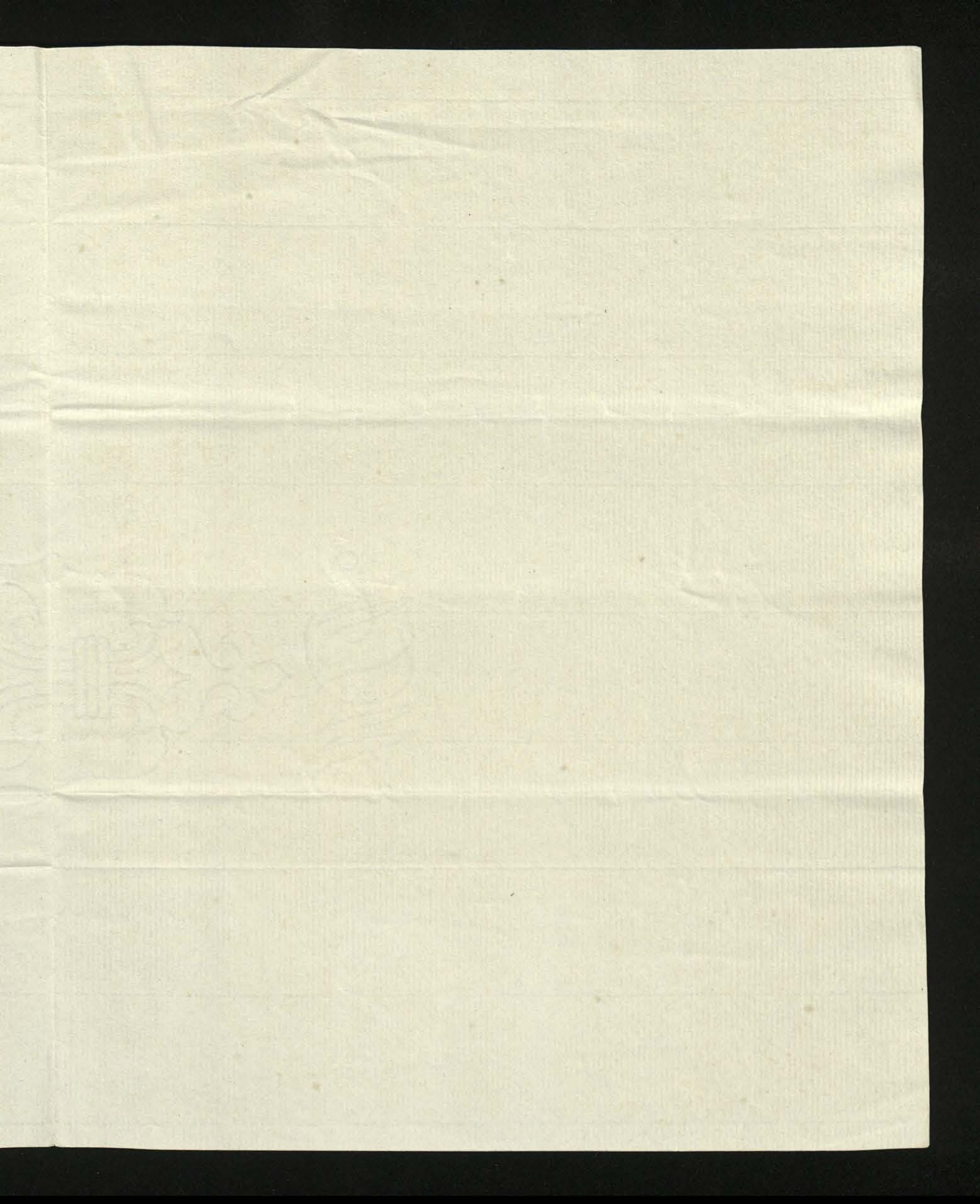

done! but He may begin immediately

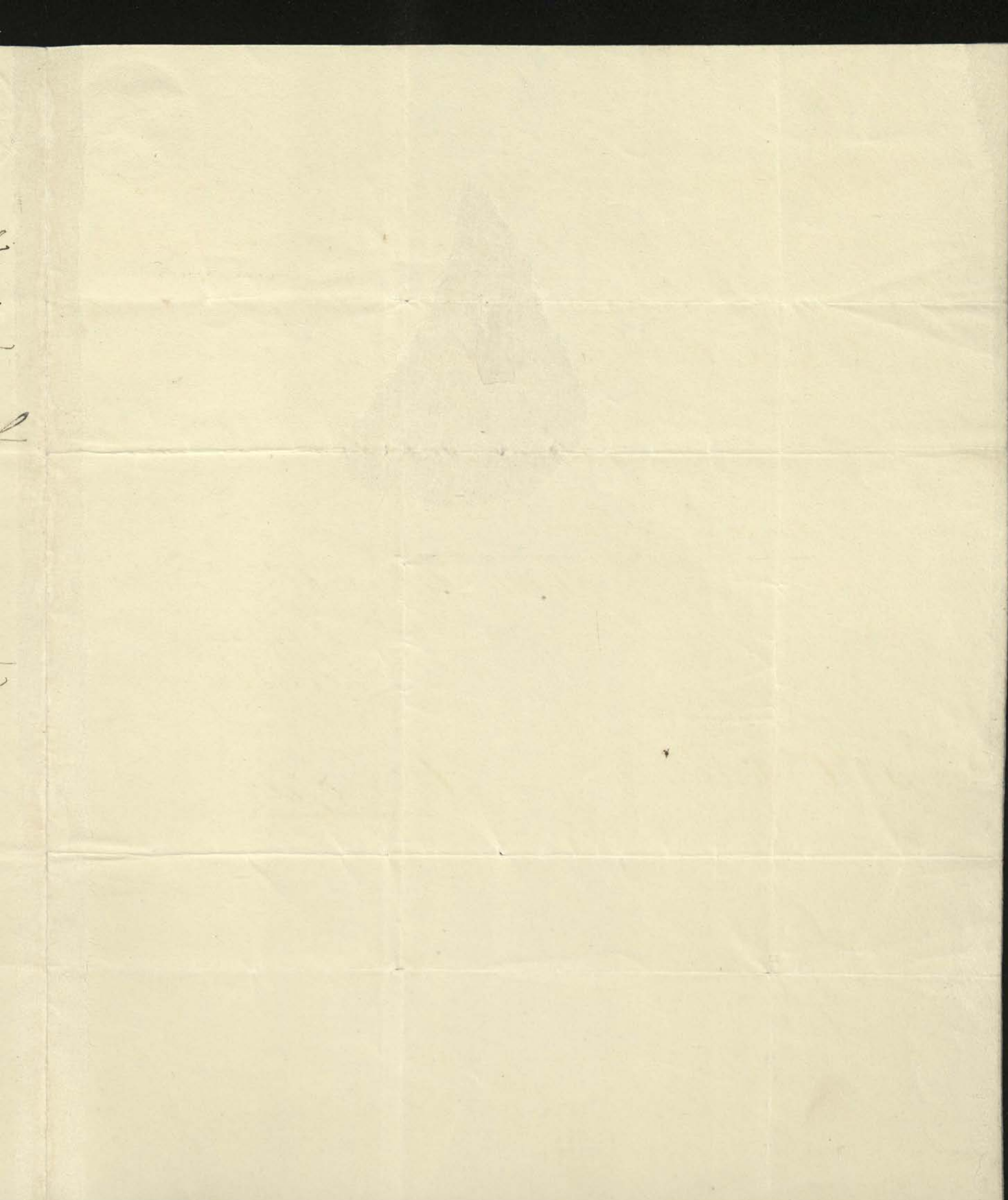
