 Guelphic Order, His Privy Purse to be the Executors
 of his said Will. — And Whereas the Commissioners
 of our Treasury have represented unto Us, that after
 reserving a sufficient Sum to meet & discharge
 any Debt of our said late dear Brother, and any
 claims which may arise on his Estate, there is
 in the Hands of the said Executors a Sum of
 Fifty

Fifty Thousand Pounds at our disposal - Now
 our Royal Will & Pleasure is, and
 therefore, We do hereby Will & Command You
 the said Arthur Duke of Wellington & Sir William
 Knighton to pay unto Major General
 Wheatley the Keeper of our Privy Purse for our
 Use the said Sum of Fifty Thousand Pounds -
 and We do hereby declare that the Receipt
 of the^d Wheatley shall be a full sufficient
 Release and Discharge to You the said Arthur
 Duke of Wellington, and Sir William &
 Knighton as such Executors as aforesaid
 for the said Sum of Fifty Thousand Pounds -
