Lambeth February 24 1829

I hope that I shall be pardoned for taking the liberty of addressing you respecting my account for two bases and two pedestals sent to the Royal Lodge Windsor - by order of the King - particulars of which I had the Honor to transmit you on the 22<sup>d</sup> of September last, amounting to £293.6.8 - from various disappointments I am greatly in want of money, and I venture to entreat the favor of payment - Mr Nash has informed me that you considered my charges for these works extravagant - but I would beg leave respectfully to assure you Sir that the cost to me of modelling and executing them amounted to nearly the sum charged - considering that they were for his Majesty I spared no expense on them - all the Bas-reliefs and other enrichments on the pedestals were modelled expressly from new designs, for them - The bases were also attended with

with considerable expense - And I am sure no Artist in  
London could produce them in any material for less money -
