I have received the enclosed
Letter from Mr. Walter, the Bill certainly
is perfectly correct and should have been

never has been paid, but it seems that I
directed the Bill to be made out into two
parts - it is so long since that I cannot
recollect why that which I then supposed
would be paid by the Woods & Forests
was not paid - but I dare say that
they refused to admit it - at all events
the work was performed and I am sure
the length of time which has elapsed is
a reason why it should be now paid =

= than why it should not, and as I am sure you will agree with me in this sentiment I hope you will enable me to discharge the account. The Maps have been those on which the various Improvements in the Park have from time to time been laid down and are no doubt with the late Kings papers - I remember myself laying down proposed Rides &c &c &c but when I was superseded in the improvements of the Cottage and of the Park I know nothing of what became of them afterwards -
