

I hereby acknowledge that the deeds relating to the respective properties at Brighton Kew and Pall Mall mentioned in the account of myself and partners against the executors of His late Majesty King George the Fourth amounting to £82, 15, 10 and this day paid by them are now in my possession; and that the deeds relating to the Brighton property are to remain in my possession during the life of Mrs Fitzherbert for the further and better securing to her her annuity charged thereon according to the arrangement made by me with that Lady's solicitor on her releasing the Executors of His said late Majesty herefrom and I hereby declare that the deeds relating to the property at Brighton from and after the decease of Mrs Fitzherbert and also the deeds relating to the properties at Kew & Pall Mall are in my hands, as the solicitor and on the behalf of the said executors of His said late Majesty George the Fourth. - Dated the ninth day of June 1832.
