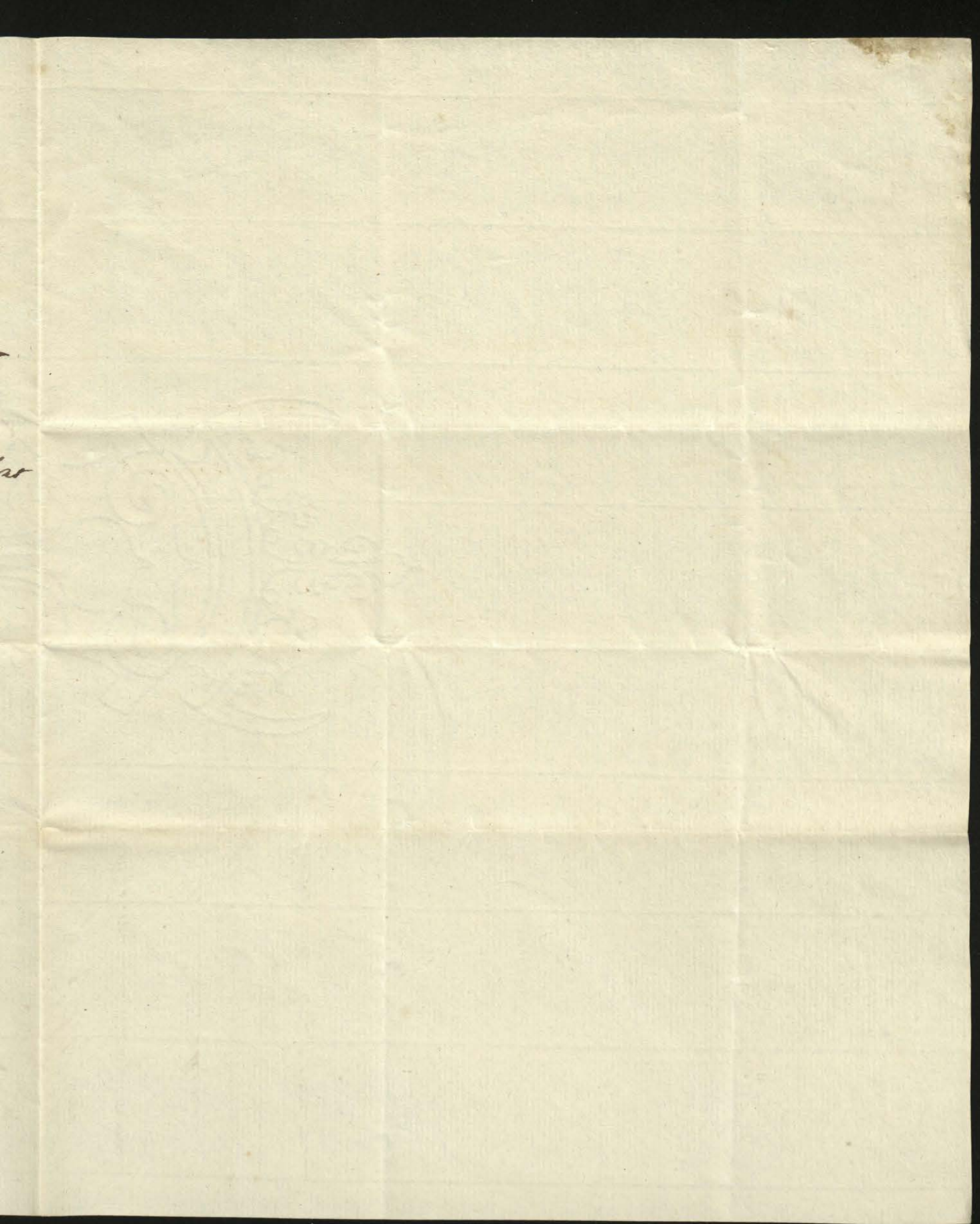

I have very unreserved Pleasure & Satisfaction
 in acquainting you for the Information of His Royal Highness the
 Prince of Wales that Mr Pitt has agreed to recommend it to
 His Majesty that an Allowance shall be made to His Royal
 Highness for the Princess Charlotte of £6000 a Year; & to
 advance an additional Sum of £2000 a Year for His Royal
 Highness; — one Quarter on each to be paid immediately; —
 there will then be a Sum of £60,000 to be repaid by His
 Royal Highness out of his free Income after the 5th of July
 1706; half of that Sum in the first half Year ending June
 5th 1707. & the Remainder in the half Year ending July 5th 1707.
 The Income of the Duchy of Cornwall will be free in the

5th of January 1805, but no Deductions will be made from that —
Remember you are to send me a Statement of the Establishment of
the Priory of Charlotte, which I think you said would amount to about
£5200 a Year — I am

And Whereas by our two several Warrants bearing date the 17th Instant We have made ordained & Constituted you to be our Special Treasurer and Receiver for the said several Sums. Now these are to authorize and Require you upon the Receipt from time to time of the moneys so directed to be issued by His Majesty, amounting together to the Sum of Three Thousand five Hundred Pounds p^a Quarter, to lay out and apply the same in Discharge of the

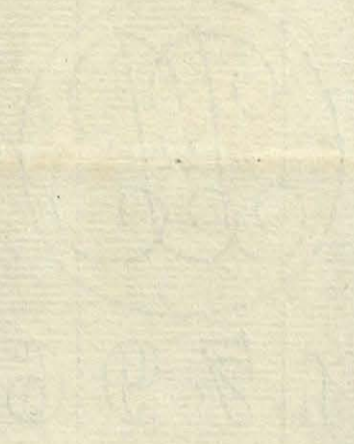
Annuitie or Pension by us settled upon M^{rs} Maria

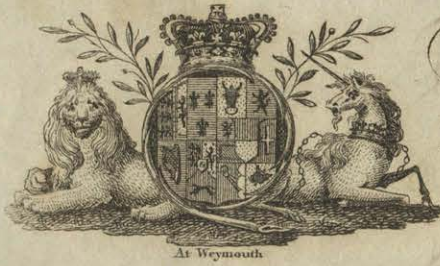

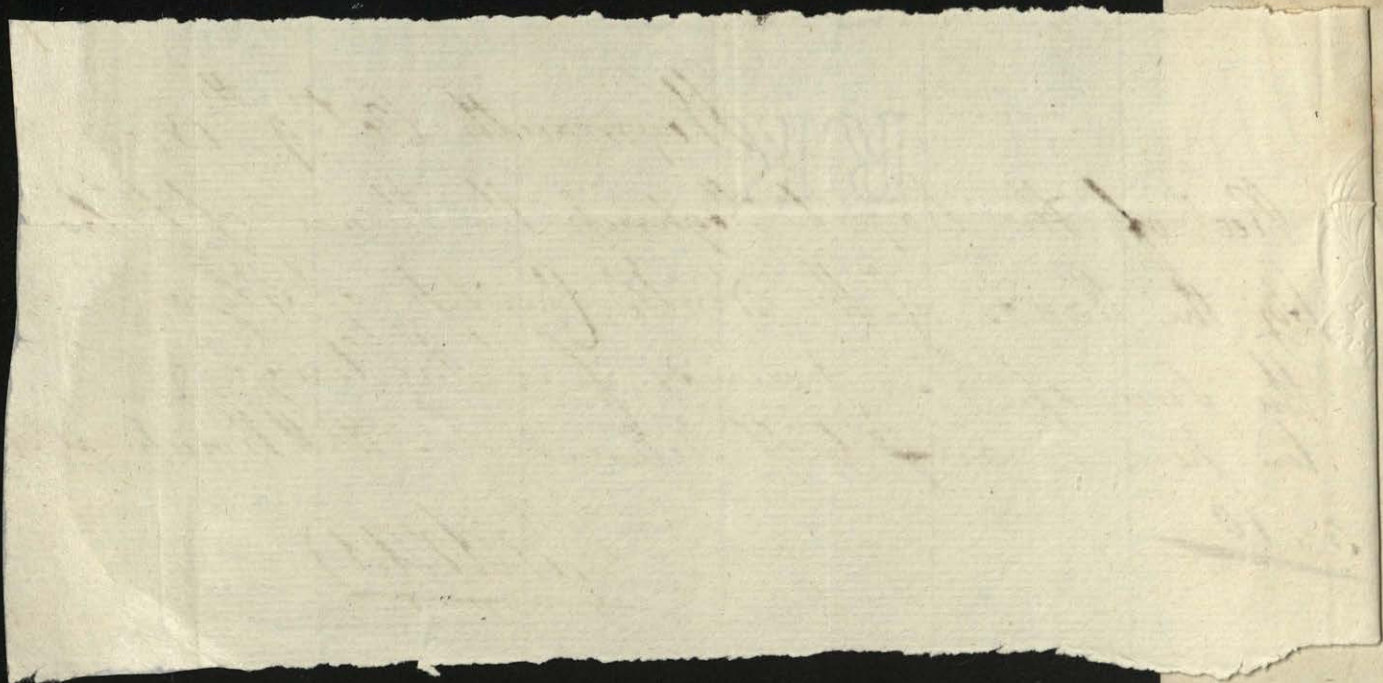

Weymouth 20 Sept 1800

The Gentleman from whom we had the House that Princess Charlotte first inhabited, leaves this place soon, and desires to have the Rent of His House previous to his Departure. I am afraid that single Article will be fifty pounds & I may add that every Article is so increased since last Year that I am quite unhappy to think our Stay is prolong'd. The last Year was £550 in all, so I dare say it will take six hundred to settle the Family down at Shooters Hill or in London. I received one hundred from you, & I imagine £500 more will be wanted. I must say Gray is very attentive & carefull, but the immense rise on every Article is very distressing. I mention what I think will be the extent of our Demands that you may prepare yourself to send it before we leave this Place & in the mean time I wish you to remit about £200 - as soon as you can.

I hope You have not forgot to look out for a good Woman Cook for Shooters Hill - Any one that has been in a good & large

Family, where an Elegant Table is kept with Economy — But on no account
any of the Under ones in the Royal Families, as they have been used to such
Expensive ways, they cannot Submit to the Rules of a regular Family
