Memorandum of an Agreement made this  
 twelfth Day of February in the Year of our Lord  
 one thousand eight hundred and one  
 Between Admiral John Willlet Payne of  
 Pall mall in the parish of Saint James's  
 Westminster on the behalf of His Royal Highness  
 George Prince of Wales &c &c on the one part  
 and George and Richard Gillow of Oxford  
 Street in the parish of Saint Mary lebone  
 and County of Middlesex Upholders on the  
 behalf of The Right Honourable the Earl of  
 Shrewsbury on the other part. Witnesseth  
 that for and in Consideration of the Covenants  
 hereinafter mentioned the former party agree  
 to take, and the latter to Lett, all that  
 Mansion, Repuage, Tenement or Dwelling  
 House situated at Shootew Hill in the County  
 of Kent, now in the occupation of her Royal  
 Highness the Princess Charlotte, together with all  
 Fixtures, Furniture or other Effects belonging to the  
 said Premises; to have and to hold the same  
 from the twenty fifth day of March next ensuing  
 for the space or term of three Years that is to say  
 to the twenty fifth day of March one thousand  
 eight hundred and four yielding and paying  
 for the same the sum of three Hundred and  
 twenty

twenty seven Pounds twelve shillings for each and every Year, and the payments to be made quarterly, unto the said George & Richard Gillow; the first payment, <sup>of Eighty one pounds, eighteen Shilling</sup> to be made on the twenty fourth day of June next ensuing the second payment on the twenty ninth day of September and so on on each succeeding quarter Day.

And it <sup>is</sup> further agreed by the parties afove mentioned, the said Admiral John Millet Payne on behalf of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales do pay or cause to be paid all Taxes whether Parliamentary or parochial which are now or shall at any time During the said term be assessed on the said Premises

And further it is agreed that if any of the furniture be missing, damaged or otherwise injured more than is usually allowed for the fair wear and tear of the same, the said Admiral John Millet Payne agrees to make good the same
