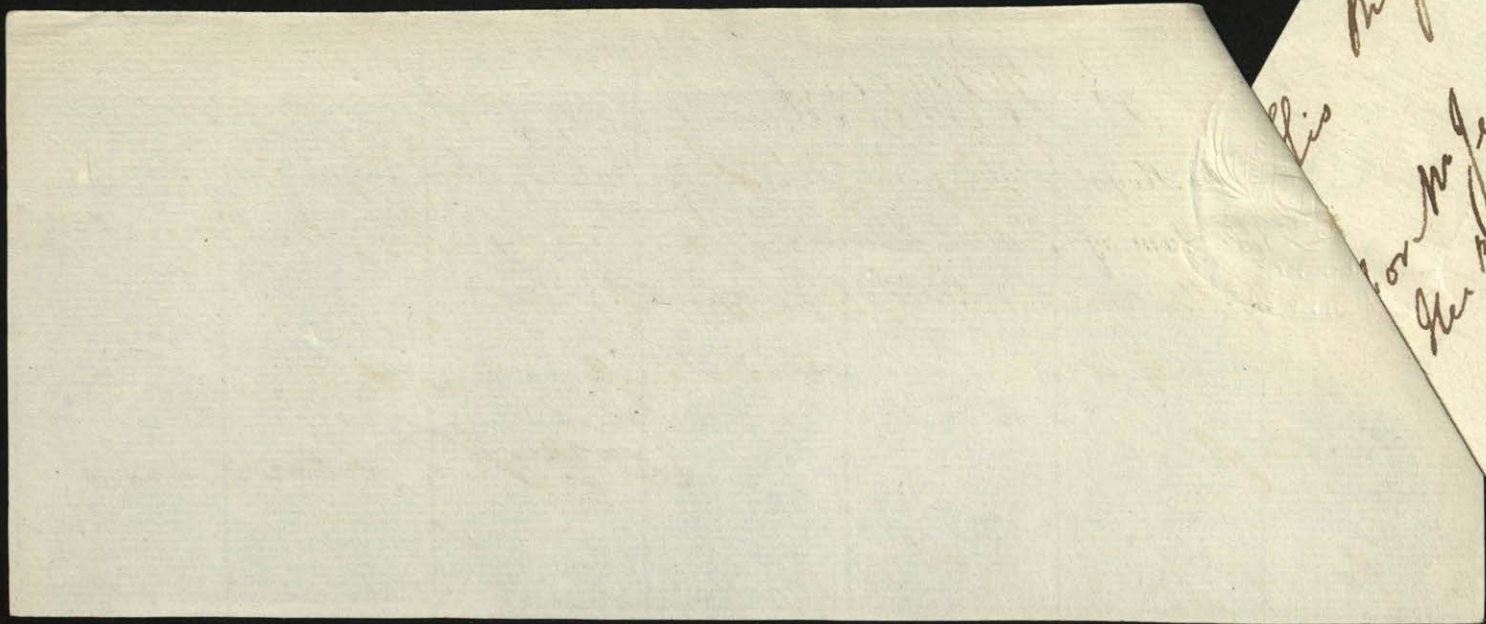

I had the Honour to receive a Visit from The Earl of St Andrews by  
 this morning, in this dreadful Weather, I did not expect his Lordship or at  
 any rate, till Princess Charlotte & I had left the House, for Blackheath — What-  
 ever was the Cause of the mis understanding of the Hours, His Lordship made;  
 I have reason to be pleased with the Mistake — His Lordship after viewing  
 the Premises out of Doors, desired to see me, & in the <sup>most</sup> Gentleman like Man-  
 ner acknowledged all the inconveniences I complained of, said he was  
 surpris'd to see every thing in such Order, and that he would with  
 pleasure make such Additions, & more than I wish'd — I said what I  
 really felt, for his very liberal intentions, but that I would not ask much  
 till I know the length of the Term it was to be engaged for. & we engaged  
 Conditionally, that if the Prince took the Lease for any time, I<sup>st</sup> Andrewsberry  
 would make great Additions — If only for this Year I should make very  
 small demands — I never met with any more liberal & polite than  
 Lord S. tho' he staid he felt having been unkindly used by poor  
 Admiral Payne but all is right now, & his People will come ~~and~~  
 make the small repairs whenever Princess Charlotte goes to Town

to stay a week or two. I also begd & obtained a month to consider of it or  
more, as I said how unwilling I was to trouble his R<sup>ty</sup> with our little  
matter, till R<sup>ty</sup> was quite recoverd. — I have therefore great hopes

that whatever ~~was~~ <sup>is</sup> determind on the Transaction will terminate agreeably

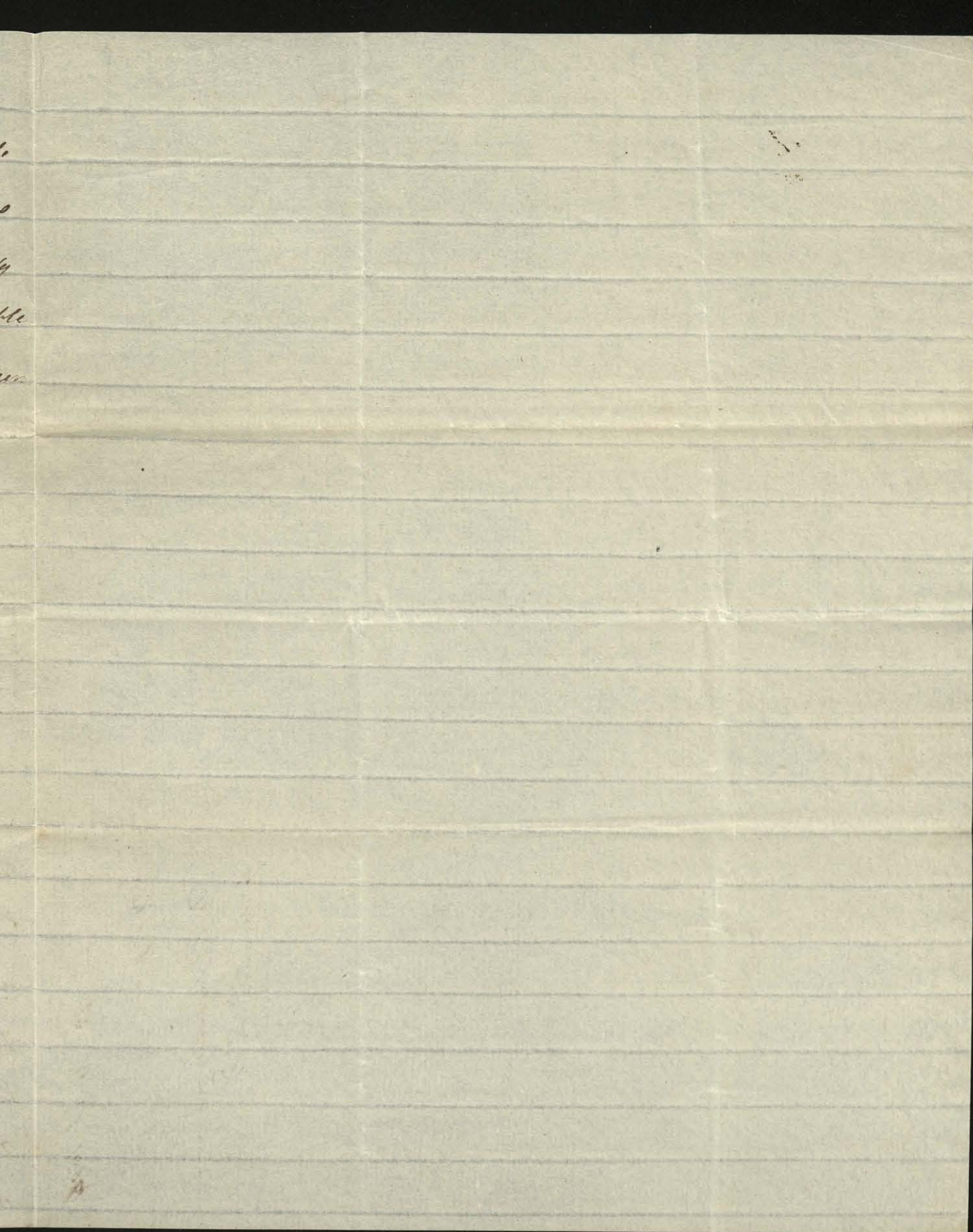
I have some faint hope of being in Town on wednesday & if possible

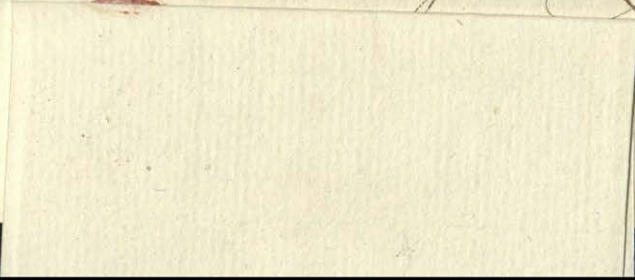

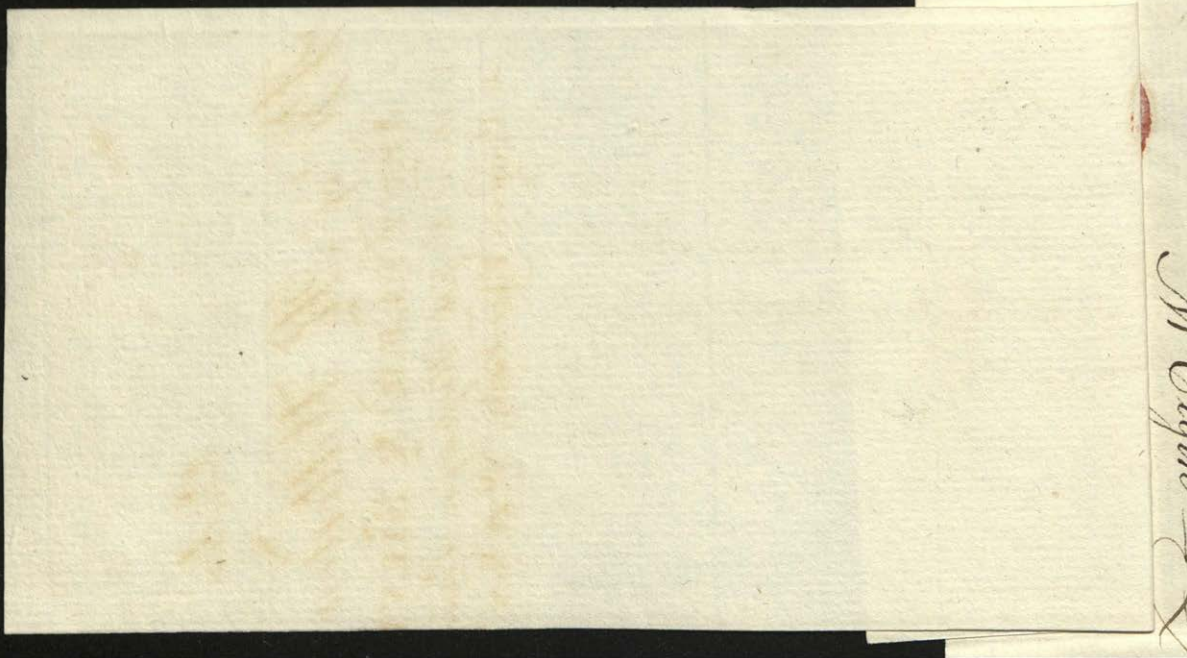

As it is now fixed that Her Royal Highness the Princess Charlotte sets out on Monday next the 21 of June for Weymouth, I request you will advance the necessary Money for the Journey — In our former Expeditions, I have generally had one hundred pound Sterling, but as that is mostly expended on the Journey, I believe it will be as well to double that Sum, & if you will send one of your Clerks with the Sum for me to sign a receipt for — to Carlton House between four or five for morrow saturday — I shall be there, or if you will take the trouble to call yourself I will then arrange some other Matters at same time — I am Sir Your most Obedient Humble Servant
