I received this morning the Favour of Your letter & all the Contents — I return the Receipt for the ten pounds signed & should be ashamed at having mislaid the former one at any other Period but the last eight months & since that I really do not feel myself accountable for any thing for what with my own illness the D^r Princesses and the continual want of the Servants I have been so harassed confused & Anxious that I knew hardly where I put any of my Papers or how I did any thing — Gray has escaped the Ague three times by a receipt from S^r Harry Neale & I hope now he will do well tho he is very weak — Robert is in bed all this day but is to try the same medicine when the Fit is of — The Weather is dreadful & I am afraid the Crops will suffer if we have not a Change soon —

I have given the Money & Receipts to be transacted by Gray - all is
right but about Dupre the Cook who left us to go to his own Country soon
after Easter when all were so ill we literally never could look out for
another, but have gone on with the Undercook - She by no means can
continue as Cook, tho' she boils a Chicken & makes our Broth very
well, & I was glad to avoid bringing a new Servant to this Place

I am very sorry for M^r Poole, & particularly as he promised him
self so much pleasure in spending this Summer wth his Mother -
