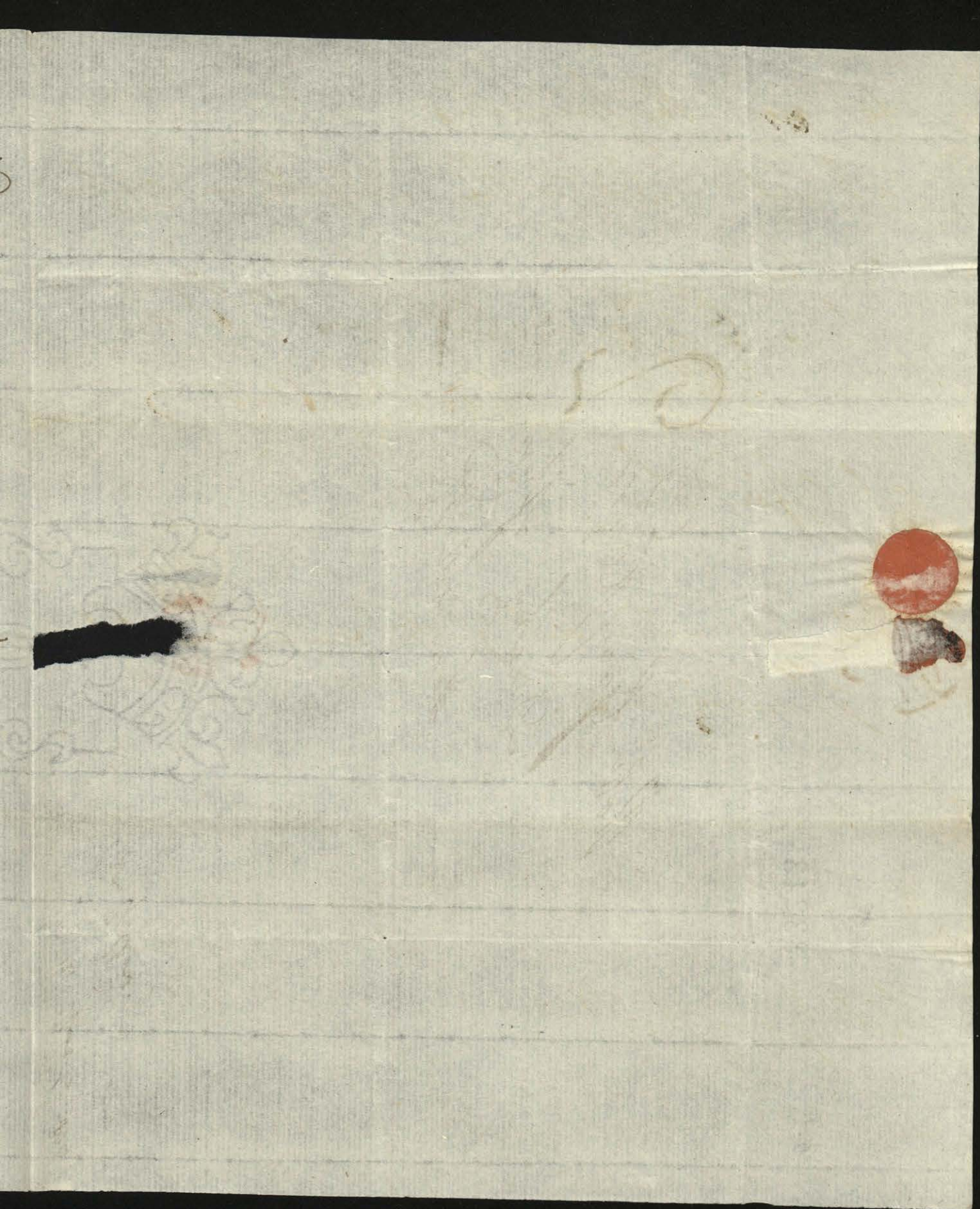

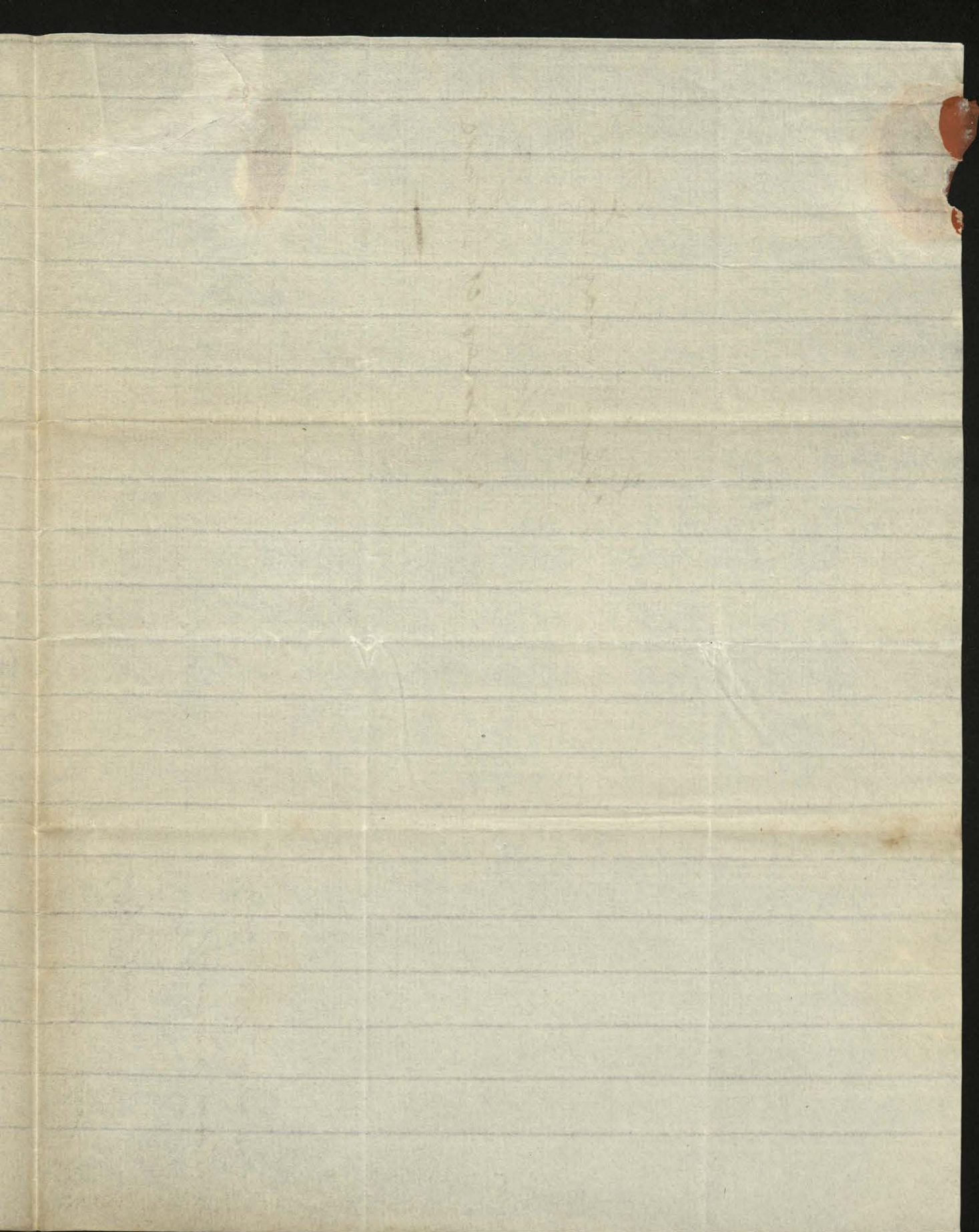

Lady Elgin presents her Compliments to Mr Gray by her Amusement, being herself much indisposed with a cold, and yet extremely anxious to reply to his Note, which she has seriously considered.

Lady Elgin informs Mr Gray that the only day in next Week on which Princess Charlotte will be out long enough for Lord Strenuous to look over the House will be Monday, and observe that if it is in contemplation to treat with the Earl for a Lease beyond the present year it will be necessary to require a very different Arrangement of the Premises, to render them at all capable of containing the Royal Highness's Family, especially with the Addition of Sub-Governors, the House being on all accounts a most inconvenient Residence for the Princess.

In my reflections this Evening on many Subjects respecting The Princess Charlotte, it has appear'd to be proper for me to return You Mr Gillon's letter, with the Copy of my letter, in order to be laid before the Prince, in the Idea of his leaving Town, — The uncommon Civility shewn by Lord Shrewsbury requires every Attention on the Princes part — Supposing His Royal Highness not going out of Town for some little time, I would beg you to wait a few days — having received a piece of information yesterday, that would have great weight were it to turn out favourably — a Person arriv'd ^{from} Eltham Park to inform me, there was a report, it was to be let, The House & Place was built by S^r Will^m James at the farther end of Eltham, & is now Lord Ranelagh's — It is a delightful Place, exactly on the opposite Side of the Hill from this — so this Hill shelters it from the N, N East Wind The House is very good; plenty of Accomodation, good Gardens — A large Farm, which would be let immediately — I went to see it this morning having forgot it, since Lady James's death, & found that it obviates all the Inconveniencs we labour under here — The lease is but for four Years, when

it reverts to Lord Branciff. M^r Baillie the present Possessor is a Rich West India Merchant, & has so many Houses that M^{rs} Baillie is anxious to part with this, but he is fond of it, he always draws back, when he is like to get it disposed of. M^{rs} B says she will get a decisive Answer, but she was in Town & very much engaged, & it might be a day or two. I would have waited to get her Answer, but was told that Parliament would & Rise the next week = You can know if the Prince is like to go away very soon. If he is not you will keep my Papers till all go together. A few words would settle it. I add no more but that I am S^r Your most Obedient

The above was wrote on Saturday night & yet having no answer I pursue my Plan to put it in Your Power to give the letter from M^r Gellens as the Prince may be going out of Town & it would be unjust not to lay them before his Royal Highness before that Event takes place. It is nothing equal to this in Beauty - as on Friday last, but Saturday & Sunday I was oblig'd to have a Fire in my own Room. A cold North East Wind and that is very unfaourable to my Precious Charge. If therefore that there is no hurry - wait I beg one day more.

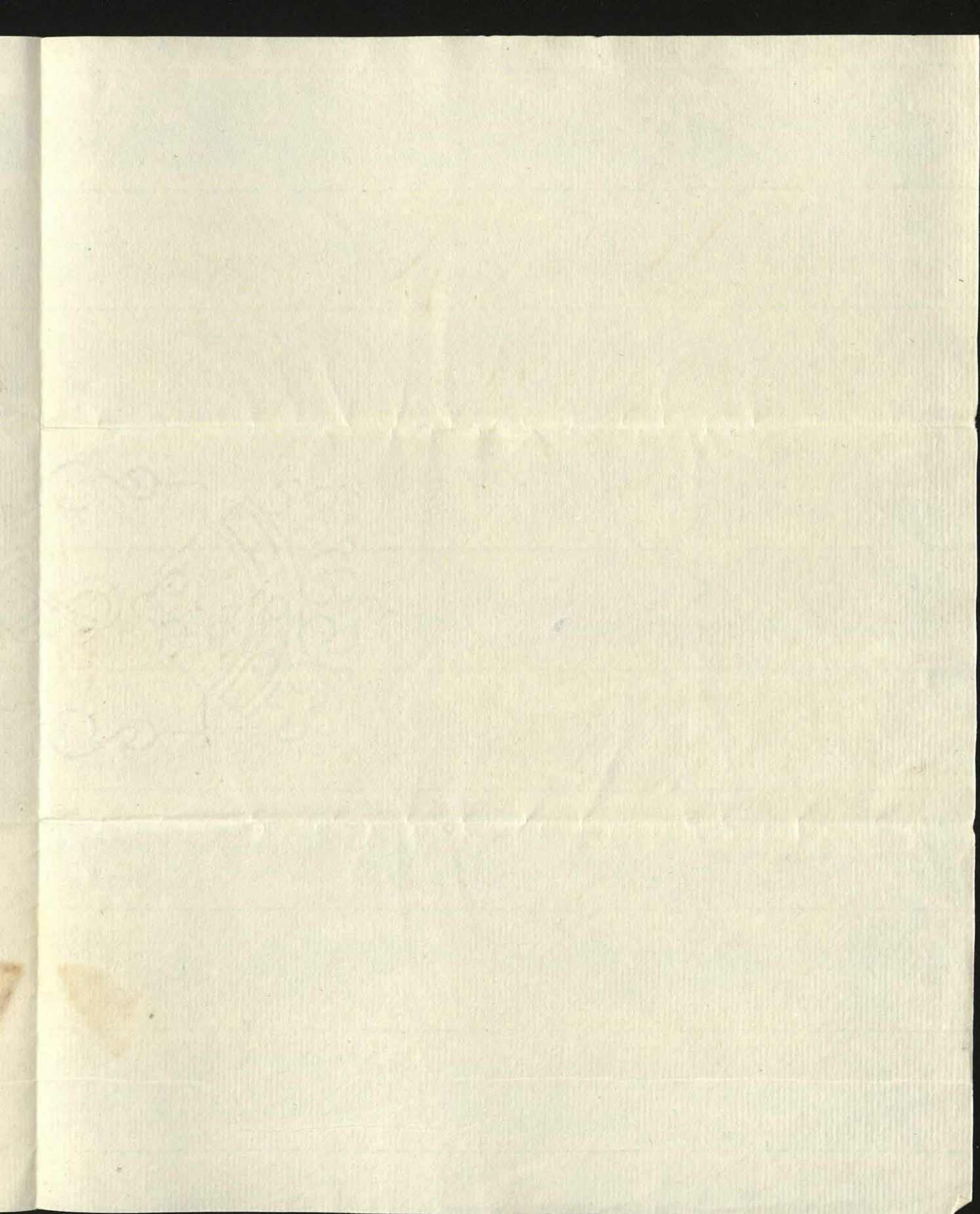

Eltham Park Saturday afternoon
(7. July 1804)

Dear Sir

I am this moment come from Town and found your Note. My Lease is in Town so that I can only speak from Memory, but it can be referred to. It is for 7. or 14. years optional to Lord Moira. The 1st. first years will Expire at Christm. next. Rent £471. 4. 4. a year and the Tenant pays the Taxes of all sorts except the Land Tax.

I am to be repaid £600. which I have laid out on the Place, the 5th. year of My Lease. and I am also to have an allowance for the Manure I have purchased. & Improved the fields with.

I cannot be guilty of so uncivil an act as to treat for it with any person without first informing Lord Moira, through Mess^{rs}. Jenkins & James the Solicitors. and I have never mentioned to them any idea of Letting the Place. It would give me Pleasure to accommodate Lady Elgin, & Particularly The Princess Charlotte of Wales. I therefore desire to be no Gainer by it, and they would not expect that I should be a Loser.

If I give it up at all, I must therefore have My Lease cancelled. what I have laid out on the Place repaid. and the Stock, Utensils (and there is nothing unnecessary) and the Crop, taken at a fair Valuation.

I beg My best respects to M^{rs}. Skimmer. in which

M^{rs} Baillie desires to join - and I am Sincerely.

Sir

I found on coming Home last Night The letter you did me the honor to write me the Day before, confirming what Lady Elgin, had Communicated to me a few Days since, respecting His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales intention for the future Residence of the Princess Charlotte. I can only repeat to you Sir, what I signified to Lady Elgin, that however Desirable this Place is for health or Comfort. I would not for an Instant stand in the way of Accomodating His Royal Highness the Prince, or any Branch of the Royal Family - but would resign My Lease to Lord Moira for that Purpose - I desired no Profit - and I was sure they would not wish me to sustain any loss in what I had done in Improving the Place since I lived here -

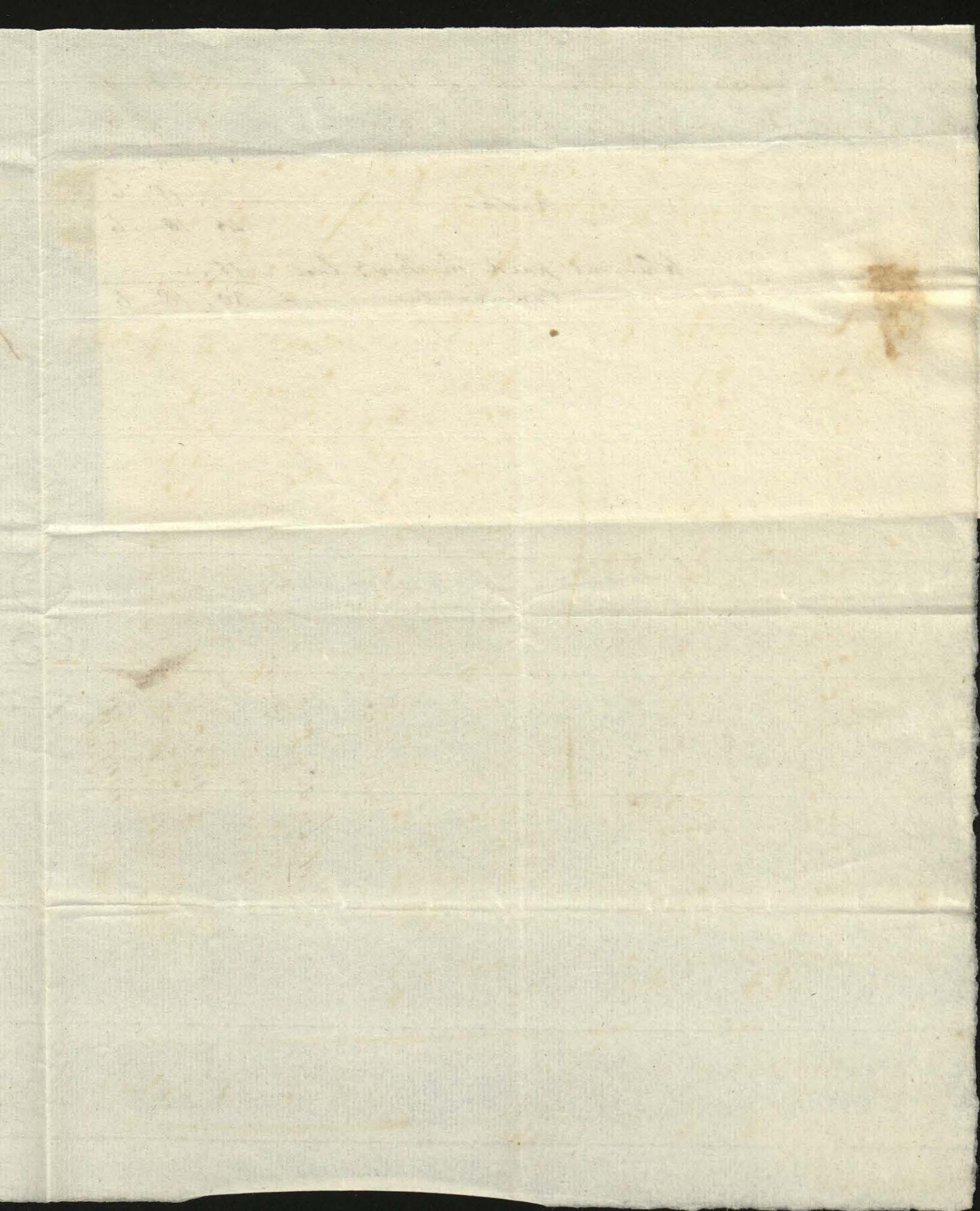
