I enclose the draft of my letter to Lord Weymouth and his answer; Lord North will see & use the most possible arguments to persuade but they have proved of no avail, I desire he will before Wednesday have a full and cordial conversation with the Chancellor & his right to know what effect this fresh defection has on his mind, besides in his high office he ought to be easily informed of your ideas as to the most efficient means of supplying the two vacancies. Lord Stormont ought to be apprized of my having directed Lord Weymouth to write the usual summonses to the Peers, to which I have received no answer, that if they are not preparing in that office, he may without further loss of time prepare them in his.
