Lord George Germain has the honor of acquainting
your Majesty that Captain Lloyd one of Mr Henry
Clinton's aide de Camp in this moment arrived.
Comte d'Estaing's fleet and army attack'd Georgia
the troops landed on the 8th of September
and were join'd by the rebels, and besieg'd
Fort Mifflin, they spar'd the Lines
and redoubt on the 9th of October
and were repuls'd with great loss;
Fifteen Hundred French and at least as
many rebels, they reembark'd the 20th of

October, the loss of the British forces was
between forty and fifty. These accounts
were sent from Augustine to New
York. So James Wallace is taken as
another Ship of war.

The letters will be given to your
Majesty at St James's but Lord George
thought it his duty to send your Majesty
immediately this short account.
