The Duke of Portland has the mortification of acquainting His Royal Highness, that His Majesty's Ideas respecting the augment of His Royal Highness's Establishment do not as yet seem exactly to correspond with those which were submitted to His Majesty by the Duke of Portland, as the unanimous Opinion of the King's Confidential Servants. His Majesty however did not appear to have formed any such resolution as to preclude further Representations upon that Subject, & the Duke of Portland is much inclin'd to believe that His Majesty's Affection for His Royal Highness will dispose Him to consult what His regard for the present state of His People induces Him more maturely to consider. The Duke of Portland is unwilling to detain His Royal Highness with the particulars of what



placed in His Majesty's Court, but will be ready to attend His Royal  
Highness for that purpose, whenever he shall have the honor of receiving  
His Royal Highness's Commands.
