I think it right to acquaint Lord North, that I have taken  
every step that could occur to Me to prevent any tumult  
tomorrow, and have seen that proper executive Orders  
have been sent by the two Secretaries of State. I trust  
Parliament will take such measures as the necessities of  
the time require; this tumult must be got the better  
of or it will encourage designing Men to use it as a  
Pretext for assembling the People on other occasions  
if possible we must get to the bottom of it, and examples  
must be made; if any thing occurs to Lord North wherein  
I can give any further assistance I shall be ready  
to forward it for my attachment to the Laws and  
Security of my Country, and to the protection of the  
Lives and Properties of all my Subjects
