At Seven o'clock the Council
for the Prosecution had gone through their
Case, having examined about twenty Witnesses
D. George had gone into his Defence, & the
first Witness was then examining.

If the Witnesses for the Prosecution
had not proved a Case, which the Judges
had thought fit for the Determination
of a Jury, they would not have put the
Prisoner to make his Defence, but have
directed the Jury immediately to have
acquitted him.
