The second part is to deprive the
Prince of the power of granting any
peers, pensions, or patent offices for

By this part of the Plan the intended Regent is to be deprived of the power of granting those Honours, Distinctions & Favours, which create or reward attachment; whilst all the arduous, hard & invidious parts of Government, those which in their nature are most exposed to doubt & objection are devolved upon him.

The third part of the plan concerns the King's real & personal property. In this property the Prince, the Princess his Brothers, & the Princesses his Sisters, have an eventual interest if the King should die intestate; but in the very first time, that in similar melancholy circumstances existing in any family, the estate has been taken out of the management of the nearest kindred.
