Dear Sir,

The Duke of York being engag'd  
with a formal set of presents writing by this day's  
Post, has desired I would acquaint your Royal  
Highness with his safe arrival here yesterday.  
The Roads were so bad, it was the utmost that  
could be done travelling day & night. On his  
arrival He found Prince Ernest, & Prince Adolphus  
perfectly well & more grown than you can conceive.  
Prince Adolphus is at least 5 ft 10. The Duke  
stopt one day at Osnaburgh & gave a dinner  
to the heads of his flock: this morning he reviewed  
the Regt of Guards. On Thursday we set out for

Brunswick, dine there & remain till night &  
then continue our journey to Berlin. The Duke  
of Brunswick is gone from thence & has ordered  
his <sup>Equipage</sup> Camp, to be sent immediately after him.  
It is intended to command in Romsaria in  
case the Prussians should go on. I rec'd from  
your Royal Highness, a Copy of the Letter the  
Duke of York rec'd this day from the King  
of Prussia in answer to the one he wrote.  
Part of the Garrison of Berlin have a hearty  
wish, the Hussars certainly. I shall  
write to you from Berlin every post as  
that I think can interest you. Believe me
