Permit me to wish your Royal
Highness, joy, of the Duke's intended change of
situation. His Majesty's consent was communicated
to him by Lord Grenville on Friday, & it is impossible
to describe how happy he has been ever since. I never
saw two people so completely in love, as the Duke
& Princess are. It is beyond any thing I ever saw or
heard of. I think your R. H. will like your better
sister very much. I'll tell her this admirable & sumptuous
Talent. her bonne vivisance & chautante voice
sings. He is now residing at Duke of York's in

consequence. has an apartment in the Palace, & eat
 semi pas le gens du Roi. Dinner from the King's Kitchen
 Gr. St. P. H. has determin'd upon accompanying the
 King to Siberia the 14th of this month, & we shall
 return here by the 28th. Nothing can be happier, except
 the parties immediately concern'd, than the King of
 Prussia is. I am very certain your Majesty's Highness
 would like him exceedingly.

There is a very strong idea here that there will be a
 general Coalition of Sovereigns to endeavour to alleviate
 at least the Situation of the King of France. Some
 will act more vigorously than others are expected to do.
 I hope you receiv'd the Book of Prussian Uniforms
 if there should be any thing else, that I can conceive
 acceptable to you, I shall take the liberty of sending
 it to you. Heymann is here & very much oblig'd to
