Dear Sir

I do assure you I have not answered a letter a long time with greater pleasure than I do yours which is now before me; for the report of your being in imminent danger was so universal, that it would have been weakness in me not to have enquired into the truth of the fact.

I wish I could give you as good an account of my own state of health as you do of yours, I am indeed to

appearance better than I was some time ago, am stronger than I was, & have in a great degree recovered my appetite which I had entirely lost; but the original complaint for which I came hither still remains, and the Physician tells me that he does not see any probability that these waters can be of any service in removing it; so that in all probability I shall move towards London the latter end of the week without having gained any advantage by my residence here.

His Royal Highness (to whom I must desire you to present my most dutyfull respects) does me much honour in having me in his remembrance.
