

Quiddhall June 14th 1700

My Lord

I am directed by the Court of Aldermen to inform your Lordship, that in Obedience to your Lordships Orders they have made diligent search in the several Wards after those disorderly Persons who have been concerned in the late dangerous Riots, and have taken to their assistance, the Housekeepers in each district, who have armed themselves under the direction of the Court, for the purpose of supporting the Civic Magistrate; but having communicated to the Court the enclosed Letters from Lord Amherst to Colonel Twisselton; who favored me with Copies of them; The Court are desirous, that some explanation may be given to those Letters, as they now militate against the orders first received from your Lordship; they also beg leave to be informed by your Lordship, whether the order sent to Colonel Twisselton by the Adjutant General, directing the Military to act without waiting for the directions of the Civic Magistrate, is to continue in force.
