I have the Honor to acquaint  
Your Royal Highness that having  
represented to Lord Amherst that the circumstan-  
ces of the Brigade of Horse artillery render'd  
it adviseable that they should break up Camp  
& return to Woolwich, His Majesty has been  
pleas'd to consent thereto. I would not take  
upon me to say any thing to Lord Amherst on  
the Subject of Your Royal Highness's Regt

of Dragoons further than that I presumed  
His Lordship would consult Your Royal Highness  
wishes as to the time of their leaving camp.  
Lord Amherst informed me that he understood it  
was Your Royal Highness's wish that they might  
remain till about the middle of October but I  
understood from His Lordship that if Your Royal  
Highness should have any Inclination to their  
quitting the Field sooner, it would be complied  
with.
