Dear Brother

I can not let Leston return to England
without sending You a few lines by Him, to tell
You that I have explained to Him exactly my
ideas concerning the Business He has been employ'd
upon.

As the French appear to be drawing all their
forces towards Mauthouze in order if possible to
besiege the Sieg, I shall march tomorrow morning
with as heavy troops as I can in order to strengthen
the Cordou on that side and to relieve a part of
the Losses of Cobourgs's army which has been

detached for some time. According to the orders which
I have received I have been obliged to part with our
friend Stewart and his Brigade, who will depart
the day after tomorrow to Coler and then embark
for the West Indies.
