I received the Inclosed Letter & Papers last night from the Duke of Richmond, which besides the Claims they set up, ~~are~~ in their Style very personally offensive to Lord Amhurst. I thought it right to send these Papers in this manner to your Majesty that you may have time to consider them, before I pay my Duty to you: & I submit to your Majesty, whether you would show me to wait on your Majesty at the Queen's Palace, ^{tomorrow,} or you would have me wait till your Majesty comes to St James's on Wednesday. If Lord Amhurst is in the right in these Decisions, the best thing that can happen is what the Duke of Richmond proposes, that the Questions should be refer'd to a Board of General Officers. I have sent already to Lord Amhurst a Copy of these Papers to prevent
