

Lady H. Seymour to Capt. Payne
Jan. 16 1795

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My Dear Mr. Payne.

It is hardly possible to be more surprised, than I was
at first, when I received your Letter yesterday, and
do not think my face has ever been any thing, but
scarlet since. I have the satisfaction of knowing
that this fact is by no means singular, as I have
received above a dozen letters to day, every one
expressing more indignation than the other. As such
anxious Conducs in the Parry. I wish I could send
you the Parry's letter to Hought, but he took it from
me, the day before he sailed, as this letter makes
his B. H. former Conducs worse. I have you a letter

from Giffin, were under such agitation of mind,
from the purity of his good feelings - begging me
and D. to remain there, until what has happened. As

feelings. The Dutch Admiral - has refused to follow

The Commodore with the sword - & says he means to
get out the fine fair wind - & Bono - and in one
step is taken & step here - is as this morning!
God bless you - pray were immediately - ever
