I am just honoured with your Royal Highnesses second letter; It is so full of personal attention and condescension to me, that nothing but a feverish cold, which makes it impossible for me to go out, prevents my waiting on you to return my humblest, and most grateful acknowledgements.

In regard to my brother, Lord Hugh Seymour, the post which is intended for him may be higher in rank, than that which he now holds, but as I feel of the conviction, which public as well as private reasons induce me to prefer his present situation, if your Royal Highness

condiscended to consult his inclina-
tions on the subject. I appeal
to your candor, and to the perso-
nal knowledge which you have of his
feelings, whether an arrangement
made for him in his absence,
and without his knowledge, ^{and}
which ^{it} would ^{not} raise him in ^{an} official ^{rank}
it has done to the world at
large) as a departure from that favor
on your part which it has
been his ambition both to
possess, and to deserve. May
I presume to add that his
whole family join with him
in that sentiment.
