My dear Sir

I have transmitted the
two official letters (signed) to the
Commissioner; under cover to Mr. Huskisson.

Not knowing whether Prince Joseph
be in town or at Southampton, I en-
closed to you a letter which has come
hither for him. On the score of twenty-
-two, it will be better not to say any
thing more to the Duke of York: Because
were the Duke's objection of a nature

to have been assured he would have dis-
-closed it, not being so, it will operate
in spite of any interest that could be
made. I fear the Duke may have been
told that Wentworth has made some
remark on the Campaign in Flanders, but
that I ever heard any thing of the sort
fall from Wentworth, but living with
a set of Censurers, I think him not un-
-likely to have said something at the
Cocoa Tree which a little exaggeration or
