Their Majesties have been pleased to appoint this day to see the Sheriffs for the like purpose. — And the Remembrancer will do himself the honor to wait on the Earl of Cholmondeley —

at Carlton House, tomorrow, about Noon, in hopes of learning from
his Lordship, or Mr. Brent, when will be the earliest suitable
time for the Sheriffs to wait on his Royal Highness, —

The Remembrancer, thinking it might be useful, and —
satisfactory, for the Earl of Cholmondeley, to be informed, what had
been heretofore done, on similar occasions; has extracted from the
City Repertories, the proceedings, upon the birth of the first born
Daughter, of the late Princess of Wales — and inclosed the same

Their Majesties having appointed to be attended by the Court at Hampton Court this day at two o'clock in the Afternoon the Lord Mayor attended by the Court proceeded in their Coaches to Hampton Court—and about two o'clock were admitted into His Majesty's presence, when M^r. Recorder in the name of the Court congratulated His Majesty on the Birth of the Princess, His Majesty received them very graciously and returned an Answer—and they had the Honor to kiss his Majesty's hand—

They were afterwards introduced to Her Majesty and Mr. Recorder in the name of the Court congratulated her Majesty on the like occasion who was pleased to receive them very graciously and they had the honor to kiss her Majesty's hand —

The Lord Mayor acquainted the Court that the Sheriffs had waited on his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales and that his Royal Highness promised to let his Lordship know when their Royal Highnesses would be attended by the Court with their Congratulations — on the same happy Occasion —

The Court was summoned to attend their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales — pursuant to appointment — the Lord Mayor with the Court proceeded to Carlton House and about three o'clock were introduced to their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales when Mr. Recorder in the name of the Court made their Compliments to his Royal Highness on the Birth of the Princess — and afterwards made their Compliments to her Royal Highness on the like Occasion — and the Prince returned an Answer in the Name of —
