My dear Sir,

In consequence of the suggestion in
your letter to Lord Mansfield, that there should
be no impediment to trying my case respect-
ing the business of the Turkey of Munnwall, before
the twelve Judges, I think it right to acquaint
you, that such a Proposal, from various
considerations, has my fullest assent.

The Reference in question, being
sanctioned by President, & reported by high
authority, you will not be surpris'd, so ma-
terially interested as I am in the matter, if I

should have examined it, not without some
attention; and I assure you, I am happy to
see the Lord Chancellor of that Day act for
considerable a part in the course of the Proceedings,
for from Actin of the present Day, I am certain
I can confidently look for every assistance
He can give me -

It appears to me, that there will be
very little difficulty in the course of this
business, as I am persuaded the King's appro-
-bation of the measure in agitation will be
obtained immediately on your Lordship's
representing its tendency to Actin, and which
you will oblige me by doing without delay

Judges, they can be settled & agreed upon by
Your Lordship, the King's Law Servants, &
these Gentlemen whose opinions I have

but one point now, upon which I shall detain
Your Lordship a single moment, which is,
my relinquishing the Petition of Right;
& I can assure You, my dear Lord, that
ever my care is before so honorable a Tribunal
as that proposed, I can have little scruple
in giving up all thoughts of presenting my
