June 23<sup>d</sup>. 1796

My dear Friend,

Some misapprehension having  
arisen, touching the ~~deleterious~~ Paper which  
I gave you, & the Copy of which I sent the King  
by the Duke of York, I must request of you  
instantly to come here; as the manner His  
Majesty appears to me to have explained a part  
of it, or at least to have understood <sup>it</sup> to be totally  
different from the meaning & signification  
in, & the construction I ever put upon it, that  
~~every~~ every thing must stand still, till I have  
seen you. & this difficulty is perfectly cleared

up, & I have determin'd not to stir one step  
therefore till I have seen you. Excuse this delay  
sincerely, the sooner you come the better, & a  
Room will be prepared for you to sleep; you  
send to Dowell to bring your pack General's <sup>own</sup> ~~own~~  
sword with you, as it will be necessary for you  
before the King's presence at Windsor. Excuse  
this hasty scribble, from

Dallendy.
