Sir

A letter from Mr. Mather gives
me the painful intelligence of Your Royal
Highness's indisposition. Tho' I trust for his
statement, that it was but light & is pro-
-bably now past, I could not receive the ac-
-count without uneasiness proportioned to my
-care of your constant kindness, and that is
-giving my feeling no ordinary scales. I wish
Your Royal Highness always to be conscious

that the manner in which you have dignified to
treat me gives you a claim upon me much
stronger than if I stood subject to any official
call: Therefore the summons with which you have
honoured could not require any of those excuses
which your condescension attached to it. I
will on Saturday have the happiness of asking
Your Royal Highness's commands. I should
prevent myself earlier, only that did I not
wait to make an arrangement here I should
be obliged to hurry back Lither directly: but I
gather from Mr. Mahon's letter that Your Royal
