-ed me. I never heard of any particular
-expression used by Lord Clare that can at
all make it requisite to write to Lord Cham-
-berlain. In the Debate, nothing was pointed
at your Royal Highness: But Lord Clare
attempted an insinuation against me, upon

which I made the proper remark, as if I
had extolled your Royal Highness in a sort
of contrast to His Majesty. The speech given
in the Papers as mine was excessively incorrect;
the ordinary Reporters having been turned
out of the House when the Bar was cleared.
I corrected it as far as I could for a re-
-publication with the other Speeches in a Pamphlet.
But when the arrangement has been si-
-mulated it is difficult by such corrections
to make the argument run smooth; and I have
