I have been the whole of the
morning writing my letters to Capel
& as I think I know the two leading
strugs of the Landgrave's Court are
Honour & Ambition, I have not failed
to touch them in the most forcible
manner I can - I am certain
the commercial connexion may be turned
much to the Interest of your Royal
Highness - Lindeman will sail without
fail in Thursday's Packet -

I am very happy to inform your
Royal Highness, that notwithstanding
those Rumours to the contrary,
no Money by any secret Article
of the Convention is to be given to the French.
It is said, Colonel Brounrigg's carried
out Orders to inundate &c. &c. - but
arrived too late, as the French had
been settled - the Guards have been
all embarked at the Helles since
Wednesday last, but have not yet
arrived; the Transports have Orders
to make the first Land they can, &
then immediately return for more Troops.

Major Coleman by the last accounts
was taken, but I do not find there is
any thing to be depended upon respecting
D. Hantley - Genl. Forbes's son has never
been heard of, & I am sorry to say, is not
a Prisoner -

Lady Elizabeth Lubbock is
dead, & I believe there is no doubt
respecting the fact -
