In consequence of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales's most gracious message conveyed to me in the favor of your last letter, upon the address I had humbly presumed to make to His Royal Highness, I have endeavored to avail myself of all that delay could do to ward off the repeated demands upon me, under the hopes of His Royal Highness's condescending remembrance. But these means are come to their expiration; that delay ceases to prevail, & I am daily and hourly threatened with actions & legal proceedings against me, which I have not

the power or ability to withstand & stop.

What then am I to do, Sir? I feel myself bound to endeavor, if possible, to rescue my family, & myself from the indignities heaped upon me from all quarters, & to save them in fact from the disgrace & ruin actually hanging over their heads, & not to be averted by me.

It is to His Royal Highness I must look; this, an exaggerated statement, I will desire you to submit, with all humility on my part to His Royal Highness's recollection & sensibility. I am confident I need say no more. I am Sir
