which letter I gave Lord Rosslyn
He read it with great attention
and found every thing ^{to} fully explained
He desired me to leave the letter
with him and to assure the
prince of Wales that he would
with great pleasure obey H. R. H.
Commands by showing my letter

to the King; If an opportunity
offered soon, to shew it to His
Majesty; He certainly would
shew it to Mr Addington letting
him know he had done it by
the Commands of the prince of
Wales, and that H. R. H. would
be pleased if Doctor Domier
just claims were attended to by
His Majesty's Ministers
So give the favor to say me at
the prince of Wales feet and
assures H. R. H. that it will
at every period of my life
