In taking the liberty of requesting that you would be so kind as to ascertain either thro' Mr Tierney or others in the Secret whether the Prussian Fleet is to act with us - And in making this request in Lord Moira's name I know I but anticipate his own intention. You are I am sure Sir, pursuaded that I would not presume to do so without being fully warranted.

The fact is that some of his best Friends in the City such as Rawcroft and Hornigold have been cub to the quick by the Doctors fallacious statement last winter and that their Wounds are not yet healed which operates very injuriously in certain arrangements. This is a Crisis which may enable them to recover those losses - for if Prussia should be with us, it will necessarily excite great confidence - I am well aware of the delicacy belonging to this subject which will thank you to apprise his Lordship of
