

Ld. Chancellor to the R.H.

The Lord Chancellor offers his humble Duty to
his Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, and
says to express his sincere & deep Regret that
he should have occasioned any uneasiness
in His Royal Highness's Mind. He explains
further that it was his Intention, since he
was conversed with his Royal Highness's Letter,
to have attended personally at Leicester House
this Morning, and he proposes to call there,
after he has been at the Queens House, in
the Hope that he may be permitted to have the

Honour of seeing his Royal Highness. He begs
 Leave to mention to him that Friday; being
 the first Day of Term, and yesterday, being a Day,
 he think a great deal of Judicial Business had
 been postponed, he had it not in his power, on
 either day, personally to meet the Kings Physicians,
 or, on either, to call at Curston House at the
 Time of Day, at which he understood, from the
 Conversation he was honoured with on Thursday,
 his Royal Highness had expressed his Pleasure
 that the Chancellor should wait upon him,

and, though communication has been made
to him, since he saw the Physicians on
Thursday Evening, that their Opinions were
satisfactory, he was anxious to see these
Gentlemen again himself, before he stated to
his Royal Highness what he conceived to be
the Opinion they expressed on Thursday, and,
that, which he understood, they have since
continued to express.

The said Chancellor in communication
his Royal Highness's Pleasure, as immediately
