This Statement is most respectfully submitted by Benjamin Spurrier, whose profession has been that of giving Instruction in the Languages, from which at present it is his Misfortune not to reap any benefit

His Wife and Four Children are at this Moment in Paris afflicted with illness, and has ever since the War endeavoured to return to her Native Country, but has not been able to find sufficient Money to pay the Expence of so circuitous a Journey, having but a small annuity for them all to subsist on, the future payment of which she is threatened will be suspended unless she applies in Person for it in London. Her last Letter under date of April the 25th states herself and one of her Children to be extremely ill, and in a very distressed Situation

The Petitioner therefore humbly implores his Royal Highness to condescend to grant some succour that she may be enabled with her Family to return to her Native Country for which they will ever be most unfeignedly Grateful

The truth of this detail Messieurs Clarkson, Agents and Solicitors of respectability N^o 39 (ex Street Strand) will vouch for, and beseeching that a portion of that Munificence which distinguishes His Royal Highness, may be extended for the stated purposes, His Royal Highness's Petitioner and Family as in duty bound shall, for His Royal Highness's Health and Happiness ever Pray
