Before this can arrive at Brighton I take it for granted an Express will have reach'd your Royal Highness to announce the intelligence, I trust the fortunate intelligence, of the intended meeting between His Majesty & your Royal Highness on Wednesday next. His Majesty's Letter to the Chancellor, as stated to me is full of cordiality & affection. This is a momentous Crisis in your Royal Highness's Life, a crisis which calls for, what I am sure will be bestow'd on it, all the Judgement Penetration & Decision

which belong to your Royal
Highness's mind. It is been
informed to me that it is probable
that his Majesty means to
proceed to measures far beyond
domestic reconciliation.

Lord Grenville is in
Cornwall. However I judged it
best to address a letter to him
at Drogheda in order that
he may be apprized of your
Royal Highness's intentions
had his Lordship been accessible
which I trust your Royal Highness
