Sir.

I was honor'd with the Receipt of
Your Commands this Morning and have
return'd my Proxy for Your Disposal. — As I
have err'd in the filling up of the Blanks, I
hope that Your Royal Highness will impute it to
my Ignorance and not to any Want of Attention,
as I have ever refused till now to dispose of my
Proxy and consequently am ignorant of the Form
required.

Whatever may be my Engagements and Arrangements
in the Country, I entreat Your Royal Highness to
believe that I should derive infinite Satisfaction

in making them subservient to Your Wishes,
and in giving my personal Attendance in Parliament
at any Times or on any Question, if it is Your
Desire, previous to the 18th of next Month when
I must otherwise necessarily be in London.

I fear that the State of my Stable is
such as to render my Attendance very feeble to
the Races at Brighton this Year, but I shall
certainly keep my Horses in the South entirely
for that Object.
