Sir,

We humbly beg leave to represent to
Your Royal Highness that we are deputed in
our official Situations as Stewards of
Newmarket to convey to you the unanimous
Wish of all the Gentlemen of the Turf
now present at Brighton, which we respectfully
submit for your Consideration.

From various Misconceptions or
Differences of Opinion which arose formerly
relative to a Race, in which Your Royal
Highness was concern'd, we greatly regret,
that we have never been honor'd with your

Presence there since that Period, but experiencing
as we constantly do, the singular Marks of
Your Condescension & Favor, & considering
the essential Benefit not only that the
Turf will generally derive, but also the
great Satisfaction that we must all
individually feel from the Honor of Your
Presence. We humbly request that
Your Royal Highness will bury in oblivion
any past unfortunate Occurrences at
Newmarket & that you will again be
pleased to honor Us there with your
Countenance & Support.
