Mr. Percival presents his humble duty to
Your Royal Highness, and begs leave to acquaint
Your Royal Highness, that the adjourned Examination
of His Majesty's Physicians before the Privy Council is
closed: and that the said President has given orders
that a Copy should be prepared with as much Expedition
as possible, which His Lordship will present to your
Royal Highness.

The Grounds of confident Expectation of His
Majesty's Recovery, and the proof of considerable amend-
-ment having taken place which this Examination
of the Physicians has afforded, appear to His Majesty's
Confidential Servants, to make it their duty to
recommend a further adjournment in the two Houses

of Parliament till this day for ought the 13th of December.
conceiving it to be their duty, to endeavour to afford ~~as~~
long a time as can consistently with the interests of the
Public be allowed, for the chance of His Majesty's inter-
-medial Recovery. But Mr Deneval regrets to be
obliged to state to your Royal Highness that he does not
think it will be possible to postpone the commencement of
Parliamentary proceedings upon this important Subject
beyond the 13th of December, unless such a material
advancement, shall have taken place in His Majesty's
Recovery, as to afford the reasonable hope of His Majesty
being enabled speedily to resume the personal exercise
of His Authority.
