that having felt it to be his Duty to go to  
London this Morning to receive the latest  
intelligence respecting the State of His Majesty's  
Health, before the meeting of the two Houses  
of Parliament a few days, he has just returned  
to Town. He regrets to have to state to  
the Royal Highness  
The Prince of Wales

Your Royal Highness that no such amendment  
has taken place in His Majesty's Health since  
the day of the last meeting of the two Houses,  
as would justify His Majesty's Servants  
in proposing a further adjournment - Your  
Petition therefore humbly submits to your  
Royal Highness that His Majesty's Servants  
do feel it their duty to propose the appointment  
of a Committee to examine His Majesty's  
Physicians in both House of Parliament,  
which examinations must necessarily  
precede any Parliamentary Proceedings
