Mr Perceval presents his humble  
duty to your Royal Highness, and acquaints  
your Royal Highness, that the Committee  
for examining the Majesty's Physicians  
has finally closed its Examination, and  
will make its report to the Ho of  
Commons this day.

Mr Perceval takes the liberty  
of transmitting to your Royal Highness  
a Copy of the Examination which was  
taken on Saturday last, and to acquaint  
your Royal Highness that the further  
Examination

Examination of Doctor Baile's this  
morning, of which Mr. Berwick has not

only to the correction of a mistake which  
Doctor Baile had made in his former  
Examination, with regard to the days

give full opportunity for its being  
read and properly considered by the Wednesday;  
it has been agreed at the Committee, that  
the day to be proposed for taking the Report  
into consideration in a Committee on the State  
of the Nation shall be Thursday next.

on which day, Mr Perceval humbly  
acquaints your Royal Highness, that he  
means to prepare those three preliminary  
Resolutions, which were agreed to by both  
Houses in 1788, respecting the incompe-  
tency of His Majesty, at the present moment,  
to the personal Exercise of His Royal  
Authority; respecting the consequent  
Obligation upon the two Houses, to provide

for

such a case; and espousing also the  
manner of providing for it by Bill: as  
it seems indispensable that the two  
Houses should understand ~~these~~ <sup>the</sup> one  
upon these points before any precise  
measure could with propriety be  
submitted to the consideration of  
either.

Mr Perceval having finished  
this note, regrets to find that the copy  
of the Examination which he intended  
should accompany it, still remains im-  
perfect - He begs to assure your Royal  
Highness however that it shall be  
forwarded with the utmost expedition  
when complete - but is unwilling to keep  
back till that part be sent, the
