Lord North, As I shall certainly wish to give the Assent  
in person to the Tax Bills, I desire you will send this  
Evening to the Chancellor that if they can be brought  
the House of Lords and returned to the Commons by  
three o'clock tomorrow I will come at that time to  
give my Assent; I hope to have a line in answer  
this night when you have heard from the Chancellor  
that the proper notice may be given for that purpose  
early tomorrow Morning.

I saw Mr. Jenkinson who gave many very solid  
reasons against the forming the six Regiments, I wish  
Lord North would see him, as also Ld. Amhurst  
and Ld. Hillsborough, there seems to be some want  
of consideration in the whole that perhaps by this  
may be cleared up; Mr. Jenkinson thinks he has been  
treated also unkindly in not being permitted to state his  
objections to the Cabinet this he had desired Ld. Amhurst  
would state, but he supposes he never did. The Adjutant Gen.  
says Ld. Amhurst does not approve of raising these Regts and Ld. Hills  
is said to be of the same opinion
