Lord North was afraid of obtaining his Majesty too low if he had enter'd this morning upon the subject of the Ecclesiastical vacancies, upon which he will take another opportunity of troubling his Majesty. He only begs leave in order to explain a part of the arrangement upon which he wrote last evening to his Majesty to mention that about seven or eight years ago he gave an absolute promise to Dr. Wollaston

to use his good offices to obtain a
lanency of Windsor for him, & that
the Secretary which he proposed for
S^r Wallusten was intended ~~to~~ at the
same time to satisfy that promise, to
provide for S^r Davis, & for a friend
& relation of S^r Syner, who is now
impatient for some provision of this
kind, & has often recommended his
relation to Lord North with great
vehemence, & some degree of dissatis-
