Lord George Germain to the King

Lord George Germain has the honor of sending to your Majesty Governor Franklin's letter, in part of which he complains of the harsh treatment the doctors met with from the Captain of the Bonetta's Coy. Lt Colonel Simcoe informs what is said of Captain Dundas's behaviour, and if your Majesty approves of it the meeting of the Cabinet thought it right that Captain Dundas when exchanged should be brought to a Court Martial for the brutal behaviour he is accused of.

The Cabinet likewise agreed that your Majesty should be apply'd to, that another Commander in Chief in North America should be appointed to relieve Sir Henry Clinton. The Chancellor agreed perfectly.
